- ★ **FABRIC** a piece of white jobelan measuring 37x36cm (15x14¹/₂in)
- ★ **THREADS** stranded cotton, listed in the key
- ★ **NEEDLES** size 24 tapestry needle
- ★ **FRAME** of your choice with a minimum aperture of 21x20cm (8¹/₄x7³/₄in)
- ★ **TOTAL COST** £18 (excluding frame)

★ **DESIGN AREA**

- 14 HPI – 21.4 x 21.4cm (8³/₄x8³/₄in)
- 18 HPI – 16.7 x 16.7cm (6³/₄x6³/₄in)
- 22 HPI – 13.6 x 13.6cm (5¹/₂x5¹/₂in)

This design was stitched using Anchor stranded cotton.

David has used lots of fractional stitches to add detail to the design and achieve a realistic look. As the duck is in the foreground, work the edge of the plumage using three-quarter stitches first and then the remaining quarter-stitch for the sky.



I really enjoyed choosing all the colours for this vibrant bird, and experimenting with the detailed areas of shading until I felt it was just right. I wanted to keep backstitch to a minimum so only added a small amount to define the duck's wings, tail and beak.

Fabric CHOICE


If you prefer stitching on aida, you'll need a piece of 14-count aida measuring the same size as the evenweave. Use a needle with a sharp point so you can easily pierce the aida when working the fractional stitches.

Thread FACTS

David designed his Mandarin duck using Anchor threads. We recommend you use the threads from the first column in the key to recreate his design exactly. But if you prefer to use other threads we have suggested some alternatives.

Time SAVER

If you are short of time, try stitching this design on light blue jobelan from *Fabric Flair*. This way you won't need to stitch the large area of sky.
