Clowning Around: Stitched over 2 fabric threads on a 14" x 11" piece of White Aida (18 ct). Six strands of floss used for Cross Stitch and 2 for Backstitch. Made into a pillow. See Buyer's Guide, page 29, for selected supplies.

(Note: Use 1/2" seam allowance for all seams.)

For pillow front, center design and trim stitched piece to measure 12 1/2" x 9 1/4".

For cording, cut one 2" x 45 1/2" bias strip of fabric. Center cord on wrong side of bias strip, matching long edges, fold strip over cord. Using zipper foot, baste along length of strip close to cord; trim seam allowance to 1/4". Matching raw edges and beginning of bottom edge, pin cording to right side of pillow front, making a 1/4" clip in seam allowance of cording at each corner. Ends of cording should overlap approx. 2"; pin overlapping end out of the way. Starting 2" from beginning end of cording and ending 4" from overlapping end, sew cording to pillow front. On

overlapping end of cording, remove 2 1/2" of basting; fold end of fabric back and trim cord so it meets beginning end of cord. Fold end of fabric under 1/4"; wrap fabric over beginning end of cording. Finish sewing cording to pillow front; remove pins.

For ruffle, press short ends of a 6" x 88" strip of fabric 1/2" to wrong side. Matching wrong sides and long edges fold strip in half; press. Gather fabric strip to fit pillow front. Matching raw edges and beginning of bottom edge, pin ruffle to right side of pillow front overlapping short ends 1/4"; sew ruffle to pillow front.

For pillow back, cut a 12 1/2" x 9 1/4" piece of coordinating fabric. Matching right sides and leaving an opening for turning, sew pillow front and pillow back together. Trim corners diagonally. Turn pillow right side out, carefully pushing corners outward. Stuff pillow with polyester fiberfill and sew final closure by hand.
